#### O COME, O COME, EMMANUEL

This title is the first line of a popular hymn for Advent, the season of the church's year that fills most of December. Emmanuel is another name for Jesus and it means, 'God with us'. In one sense, then, it is a good theme for December, as we prepare for the celebration of Jesus' birth at Christmas. However, there's a parallel understanding of this hymn, a longing for Jesus to return at the end of time.

As part of a recent Service of Memorial we lit candles in memory of people who have died. The candles were set out in a cross shape between the choir stalls at the front of church. I took a photo which shows them in the darkness, with the

brightly-lit communion table beyond. I like the picture, because it reminds me of this season of Advent. We find ourselves in dark times. Perhaps that's just the season, with nights getting longer and temperatures dropping. Perhaps it's a reaction to worrying news in the world. Perhaps it's personal or family troubles. The Christian faith gives us hope of a better time, when all things will be put right; there will be iustice and peace for all; God's kingdom will come, on earth, as it is in Heaven. In my picture this is the brightly-lit communion table. We are still in the dark, but even in the dark there is light – the candles in the shape of the cross.

Jesus was born at Christmas and lived a human life to experience the same

darkness we all do. And he rose from the dead and promised never to leave us and one day he would come again in glory. And so, through his cross and his presence with us, we have 'strength for today and bright hope for tomorrow'.

As we go through Advent together we don't shut our eyes to the difficulties and darkness of the world but rather pray that we will know Christ's presence with us

in the midst of it. Please come and join us for our Benefice Advent Carol Service in Kingham on 27th November at 6pm & other events and services. Please contact us if you'd like to pray with someone, or if you'd like to know Jesus for yourself.
