Dear Reader

'There is a time for everything, and a season for every activity under the heavens'. (Ecclesiastes 3.1)

Sesame & Tahini Cookies

1/2 cup sesame seeds
1 1/2 cups ground almonds
1/2 teaspoon bicarbonate of soda
1/4 teaspoon sea salt
1/3 cup honey
1/3 cup tahini
1 teaspoon vanilla extract

Preheat oven to 350 F and line baking sheet with baking paper. Pour sesame seeds into a bowl.

Mix ground almonds with bicarbonate of soda and salt. In another bowl mix all wet ingredients. Add the dry ingredients to the wet ingredients and stir until well incorporated.

Scoop the dough into small balls, around 1 1/2 inches. Roll the balls in the sesame seeds then flatten them into 1/4 inch think rounds. Place on the baking sheet, about 2 inchesapart.

Bake for about 8 minutes, until the bottoms are golden. Transfer to a wire rack and cool before serving.
