CENTREPOINT

News and updates for: Chastleton, Cornwell, Little Compton, Little Rollright and Salford

Dear Friends

Let me introduce myself. I'm Ursula Simpson, the newest member of the clergy team for the Chipping Norton Benefice. My husband, Roger and I, moved into Little Compton at the end of April from York, our home for 17 years.

I was ordained when our children were older and for the past six years led an inner urban church in York. It was the increasing brood of grand-children which drew us south! Some of you will know our daughter-in-law, Martha Simpson, curate for the Benefice and married to our oldest, Tom. Others of our married children live in London, Rio and Jordan.

My role is to develop the small groups within the churches of the Benefice - and through them, discipleship and lay-leadership. It feels very early days as Roger and I disappeared after moving for about month on a long planned visit to our son and his family in Jordan. It was fascinating to get a feel for how Jordan is coping with the huge influx of refugees. Western aid pours in to keep the region stable. We visited two remarkable local churches who have developed huge relief ministries, one among Iraqi Christian refugees, the other among Syrian Muslim refugees.

This is the area of the world where Christianity started and spread out.

As I write this, I have been preparing to speak at June's monthly Songs of Praise in Little Compton on the story of the Roman centurion, Cornelius, who has a vision (while he's praying) in which an angel tells him, a Gentile, to send for the apostle Peter. The angel tells him exactly where he can find Peter. Meantime, Peter also has a vision (while he too is praying!) in which God tells him that it's ok to go to Cornelius' (Gentile, non-kosher) home in Caesarea. There, Cornelius has assembled his whole household to hear from Peter, who tells them all about Jesus. Then an astonishing thing happens. The Holy Spirit falls on all these Gentiles. This is mind-blowing to Peter and his Jewish companions who 'hear them speaking in tongues and praising God'! God is blessing these 'outsider' non-Jews just as he had blessed them with the gift of the Holy Spirit on the Day of Pentecost! God saw Cornelius' heart and his longing for more of God.

You can read this story in the Book of Acts, chapter 10. If it's been awhile since you read the Book of Acts (or have never read it), give it a go. It makes amazing reading of God working in people's lives.

And, today, He still comes to meet those who are hungry for him.


