

Dear Friends,

A friend of mine who grew up in a small village in Kenya told me how - when she first arrived in the UK in winter - she thought it was very sad that so many of our trees were dead. She'd never seen the change in seasons that we take for granted each year, and when Spring brought with it such an incredible burst of new life, she was overwhelmed by its beauty.

In the Bible, Jesus talks about seeds having to 'die' and be buried in order to bring forth new life and bear greater fruit, using that image as an illustration of what had to happen that first Easter, when he himself died, was buried and then rose again.

Without Jesus' bodily resurrection, Christianity (with all of the good, and the morals which underpin our laws and society that we also take for granted) would never have happened. Today, though, people have often never considered the overwhelming evidence behind the central claims of Christianity and so miss the deep personal significance and fulfilment that comes with a living faith in Jesus.
